

Public transportation

To move around the city, its recommended to use public transport over driving or taking a taxi. Nuremberg, mostly the Old town, is basically car unfriendly.

Tickets

There are generally three kinds of tickets. Probably the best and easiest solution for you will be a day ticket.

Tickets are available to buy in any UBahn or SBahn entrance or platform in machines. Some of them accept credit cards, but do not count on that. Tickets are also supplied by Deutsche Bahn services centre's and even in some hotels.



Ubahn - subway


Operating daily between 5 a.m. and 12 p.m.

Lines:

- <u>U1</u> Hardhöhe Fürth Plärrer -Hauptbahnhof Messe Langwasser Süd
- <u>U2</u> Röthenbach Plärrer Opernhaus Hauptbahnhof Flughafen
- <u>U3</u> Gustav Adolf Straße Plärrer Opernhaus Hauptbahnhof Friedrich Ebert Platz

And support lines:

- U11 operated on U1 between Eberhardshof and Messe
- U21 operated on U2 between Röthenbach and Ziegelstein





Strassenbahn - trams

Operating daily between 5 a.m. and 12 p.m.

Trams are a good and comfortable way to move in the city. Unlike many Europe cities, Nuremberg doesn't have tram lines direct in the old city centre.

- <u>8</u> Worzeldorfer Straße Frankenstraße Christuskirche Schweiggerstraße -Hauptbahnhof - Rathenauplatz - Erlenstegen
- 9 Doku-Zentrum Wodanstraße Schweiggerstraße Hauptbahnhof -Rathenauplatz - Ebert-Platz - Thon



Bus lines

Operating daily between 5 a.m. and 12 p.m.

There are about 50 bus lines in Nuremberg. They are meant to bring you to UBahn or SBahn stations or to outside parts of the city. If you don't have a ticket on you, you can buy one from the driver. Board the bus through the front door, so the driver can see your valid ticket.

Night liner

If you happen to be out in late night hours on Friday or Saturday nights, there is a night bus. Starts every hours from Hauptbahnhof in all directions.



If you stay and move just within Nuremberg, you will probably not use SBahn. However, to reach more distanced points you will need to know how.

Tariff zones

If you drive with a SBahn, you may leave the Nuremberg zone so you need to purchase a ticket for a relevant zone. Ask in Deutsche Bahn service centre in the Main train station for an assistance.
